So how do you choose a location that is best for you?

“It’s close to home” or “It’s where my friends are going”

While many students choose a camp close to home, or the camp where their friends are going, remember that a camp is mini-training for college. Why not extend your boundaries geographically and meet new friends from all over the globe? Choosing a location away from home or friends is a great way to develop independence. These are valuable skills and AwesomeMath is a wonderful place to practice in an environment of like-minded individuals.

Consider the location based on the dates that ensure you won’t miss teaching days

Our camp is a rigorous 6 hours per day, 6 days a week program. We do not recommend students miss more than 2 days of class; otherwise they will get too far behind.

Choose a location that gives you the best options for traveling to/from camp

- All camp locations have reasonably sized airports nearby that aren’t too large to navigate, nor too small to find flight choices.
- Families should be familiar with our travel guidelines BEFORE making a decision about how and when they will get to camp. Some families find that flight options work better for them for one location vs another.
- Certain airports offer more flight options for students who travel internationally

Choosing a location that offers a Day (Commuter) student option

We offer this at UT Dallas and the University of Puget Sound locations.

Age and maturity of a student

Social and emotional maturity are key factors in ensuring success of our residential students, so unless a prospective student shows evidence of remarkable maturity in these areas, a student under 13 years of age is encouraged to attend as a day student.

Choosing a camp location because you are interested in attending that university

AwesomeMath is not affiliated with any of our hosting universities. Students who are interested in attending a specific university for their college education should keep in mind that we are not advising students to make a particular college decision. However, we can support students in their endeavor to expand their knowledge about that university by allowing them to attend an official campus tour (special permission and adequate notice are required before the start of camp). In addition, we organize informal campus tours (on the weekends) if there are enough interested students.

Consider the total cost of attendance of a Day vs Residential Student

The day student rate is less since the camp fee excludes overnight accommodations and extra meals. Refer to our website to learn more about what our tuition includes and excludes.


