Recommendation Letter Instructions for Mathematics Teacher/Mentor

The student who has asked you for a recommendation letter is applying to the AwesomeMath Summer Program 2020. In order to get a complete picture of the student, we ask them to take a qualifying exam and to solicit two recommendation letters: One from a mathematics teacher or mentor and one from someone who is familiar with the student's activities and accomplishments *outside* the world of mathematics. All information you provide will be held in confidence and disclosed only to the Admissions Committee. INSTRUCTIONS:

Please address the following prompts:

- Comment on the student's skills, problem solving, and reasoning ability, willingness to accept the challenge of difficult problems and concepts, effort and determination, overall academic achievements, and potential.
- What are the first three words that come to mind when describing this student?
- Comment on the student's character, citizenship, and contributions to your community.

Feel free to add any additional information that will give us a more comprehensive picture of the student.

SUBMISSION REQUIREMENTS:

- The recommendation must come directly from the person writing the letter. Please submit as a pdf document or in body of your email to admissions@awesomemath.org.
- The Subject Line of your email should be written in the following format: Math Teacher/Mentor Rec for First Name Last Name, UIN# (the student's 9-digit Unique Identifying Number). Example: *Math Teacher/Mentor Rec for Jane Doe UIN 123456789*
 - **IMPORTANT:** We have many applicants, some with the same name, therefore **it is important that you indicate on your submission the Student's 9-Digit UIN (Unique Identifying Number)**. Students receive their UIN when they set up their AwesomeMath Student Account and apply to our summer program.
